The election of the new bishop took place at the 2022 Pacifica Synod Assembly May 19-21, 2022 at the Irvine Marriott Hotel.

Clairemont Lutheran/Iglesia Luterana was represented by Pastor Jon, Pastor Cyndi, Bill Fredericks, Susan Gjereset, and Angelina Vasquez. Pastor Cyndi was one of the nominees for bishop, but was eliminated after the third ballot.

Council Meeting Highlights May 10, 2022

Building update: The demolition is complete. The soil is OK for reuse and we are ready for construction. ABG will not continue in the construction phase. A new contractor is lined up, Erickson-Hall, and a new \$2.7M GMAX contract has been negotiated. A congregational update from PMMTC (Project Management Ministry Team Committee) occurred on May 22. We have about \$1.3M on hand and \$1.3M at 3.85% loan available from Mission Investment Fund, with some payments still due. Contact James Acosta or Gary Jaus with questions. **Parsonage:** Certain critical items are being addressed. \$20K was approved for floors, termites, and drains. Many other items need attention. The kitchen will be expensive, and certain carpentry tasks have been proposed. The Mi Casa/ Su Casa campaign is raising funds for the renovation. They will be placed in a designated trust account.

April was similar to 2019 in terms of giving, but Easter was a disappointment. Giving was lower than expected. We are a bit behind in terms of the giving/ expenditure balance.

Fraud update: The police report is complete and has been filed. We are


